

Terrorists Say "We need to fight them over here so we don't have to go over there"

After years of pressure from members, Al Qaeda released previously classified documents. Yet still, more moderate terrorists claim that, while, now they simply have to respond to the biggest attack on Terrorists since the Crusades, that was no reason to escalate the conflict.

Some terrorist even maintain that they may be to blame saying "We need to stop and think here, what is it about ourselves and our behavior that makes us want to blow them up?"; However, Terrorist leaders dismiss this notion as "absurd"; saying "why should we care about why we want to blow them up? We are at war, and we can't pull out of this conflict now, the stakes are too high so we must show resolve, plus, we don't have to travel very far to kill them";
